Service Awards



GE “Bud” DeHaven Service Award

Honors an Academy member who has demonstrated sustained and extraordinary service to APTA Pediatrics.

Tricia Catalino, PT, DSc

Tricia Catalino PT, DSc, is Program Director and Professor of the Hawai'i Pacific University, Doctor of Physical Therapy Program and Interim Dean of the HPU College of Health and Society. She is a Board-Certified Clinical Specialist in Pediatric Physical Therapy and a graduate of the APTA Education Leadership Fellowship. Dr. Catalino is a member of the APTA Pediatrics Board where she serves as Director of Professional Development. She has also served as APTA Pediatrics Annual Conference Co-Chair, as Vice Chair and Chair of the Early Intervention SIG, and as Chair of the Nominations Committee. Dr. Catalino is Chief Delegate of APTA Nevada, serves on the professional development committee for the APTA Academy of Physical Therapy Education, and is the physical therapy coordinator for Nevada LEND. During her 20 plus years of practice, Dr. Catalino has served children with disabilities and their families in the early intervention setting.

Karen Tartick, PT

Karen Tartick, PT, has been providing physical therapy services for over 37 years in a variety of pediatric settings, including early intervention, acute care, NICU, and in both the North Carolina and New York school systems. She graduated from the State University of NY at Buffalo in 1984 and has been a clinical instructor throughout her entire career. Karen is an APTA Advanced Clinical Instructor. She served as mentor for the school-based portion of the pediatric residency program at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and Duke University Health System. Karen contributed to several fact sheets on behalf of the APTA Pediatrics School SIG. Karen presents nationally on various topics, including autism, embedding physical therapy interventions in school settings, adaptive equipment for children with complex needs, and the role of school therapists in successfully transitioning from high school.



Distinguished Service Award for External Advocate

Recognizes an individual or institution that has made contribution(s) of exceptional value to APTA Pediatrics.

Paul J.M. Helders

Dr. Paul Helders has served the profession of physical therapy in his home country, the Netherlands, the United States and the greater international community for more than 50 years. This service, primarily to pediatric physical therapy, has taken the form of expert clinical practice, sustained research into pediatric conditions to improve practice, the leadership of a child development center and mentorship of numerous students in Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) programs and leadership in the dissemination of evidence to improve practice. Dr. Helders was Professor and Chair of the Department of Children's Physical Therapy at the University Medical Center and Children's Hospital in Utrecht, the Netherlands. He has published more than 200 articles in peer reviewed journals, was honored by the Dutch Society of Rheumatology for innovations on the care for children with Juvenile Rheumatoid Arthritis, and has organized several congresses with medical colleagues on children with chronic disease. He initiated a 4-year course on pediatrics that resulted in a massive upgrading of pediatric knowledge and expertise. Dr. Helders served on the editorial boards of both Pediatric Physical Therapy and Physical Therapy journals.

Frances Baratta-Ziska, PT, DPT, MS

Frances Baratta-Ziska, PT, DPT, MS, is a Clinical Lead at the Pediatric Rehabilitation Department at Hospital for Special Surgery and provides direct clinical care to her pediatric clients and families, education and training and develops staff clinical competencies. She is Board Certified Clinical Specialist in Pediatric Physical Therapy with the American Board of Physical Therapy Specialties. Frances holds a DPT from Temple University, a Master of Science in Health Administration and Bachelor of Science in Physical Therapy degrees from CUNY Hunter College and is currently pursuing her PhD in Pediatric Science at Rocky Mountain University of Health Professions. Frances has lectured both internationally and nationally on various topics relating to torticollis, skeletal dysplasia and exercise. Frances is a published author on topics related to osteogenesis imperfecta, skeletal dysplasia and telehealth. She has been practicing PT for over 30 years in both center based and private practice settings. Frances is committed to helping her patients achieve their goals and ultimately, participate in activities that are meaningful to them.

Research Awards



Stephen Haley Research Award

Recognizes an Academy member who has performed sustained and outstanding basic, clinical, and/or education research pertaining to pediatric physical therapy.

Anjana Bhat, PT, PhD

Anjana Bhat, PT, PhD, is an Associate Professor of Physical Therapy (PT) at the University of Delaware. Her lab studies motor development of children with ASD and how that impacts their overall social communication and cognitive development through a study of developmental trajectories and various intervention effects including music and movement, yoga, exercise/play, and videogaming. After receiving her PhD in Movement Science from the University of Delaware, she completed a post-doctoral fellowship in Autism at the Kennedy Krieger Institute and first joined the University of Connecticut as an Assistant Professor of PT and later moved to the University of Delaware's PT department. Her research has been supported by various federal agencies including NIH, HRSA, Autism Speaks, and the Dana foundation. The findings from her research highlight the lack of gross motor/physical activity interventions (including PT services) offered to children with ASD and the need for greater motor screening, assessment, interventions, and accommodations for this population.



Dissertation Award

Kara Boynewicz, PT, DPT, PhD, ATC

Kara Boynewicz, PT, DPT, PhD, ATC, is a board certified pediatric physical therapy specialist with over 22 years of clinical experience with infants and children in the NICU, hospital, early intervention and outpatient settings. She was awarded her PCS certification in 2007 and re-certified in 2015. She received her B.S. in zoology and athletic training from Eastern Illinois University. She earned her master's & transitional DPT in physical therapy from Governors State University and her PhD at East Tennessee State University in Early Childhood Education. She is currently an assistant professor in the department of physical therapy at East Tennessee State University (ETSU) and is a core faculty member in the Vanderbilt Leadership Education in Neurodevelopmental Disabilities (Tn-LEND) program. Kara's interprofessional clinical research uses standardized outcome measures to determine the effects of prenatal opiate use on newborns for early identification of delays, specifically with motor development and neurobehavior. Her research focus is understanding early brain development with early identification and prevention of infants and children at risk for developmental delays.

She is the author of over 60 peer-reviewed publications including *The Handbook of Pediatric Physical Therapy, Third Edition*. Dr. Long is the recipient of a variety of prestigious awards including, the Lucy Blair Service Award from the American Physical Therapy Association, the Jeanne Fisher Distinguished Mentorship Award from the American Academy of Pediatric Physical Therapists, and the Bud Dehaven Award from the American Academy of Pediatric Physical Therapists.
