

Hosting the APTA Pediatrics Research Summit in October 2023 to focus on the contemporary topic of precision rehabilitation research for children with neuromotor conditions.




Advancing the integration and expectation of diversity, equity, and inclusion throughout all APTA Pediatrics activities.
