Summary of the 2018-2021 Strategic Plan

2021 closed the books on the Strategic Plan that has guided APTA Pediatrics since 2018. Here's a look at some of the highlights that APTA Pediatrics worked on in 2021:

GOAL 1: Advocate for meaningful participation of all children.

- Represented pediatric physical therapy to APTA in legislative, regulatory, and payment advocacy
- Shared information with members through <u>Milestones</u> (our member newsletter), <u>social media</u>, and/or on the <u>website</u>
- Provided <u>reimbursement and Medicaid advocacy resources</u>
- Represented pediatric physical therapy issues at APTA's Federal Advocacy Forum
- Represented members through our State Pediatric Advocacy Liaison (SPAL) network, including work with APTA on state-specific legislation related to pediatrics
- Represented APTA Pediatrics in APTA's House of Delegates and voted on behalf of our members
- Edited our bylaws to add an elected Delegate position, now that specialty sections have a vote in the House (bylaw edit was approved by membership at CSM 2022)
- Hosted <u>Fitness Initiative</u> to benefit the <u>Wonderfund</u>
- Worked with APTA on ChoosePT and media relations related to pediatric physical therapy

 Provided <u>resources for families</u> and worked with APTA to update a number of pediatric symptom guides

GOAL 2: Enhance educational pathways to practice in pediatric physical therapy.

- Hosted <u>APTA Pediatrics Annual Conference</u>, <u>Innovations in School-based Physical Therapy</u> <u>course</u>, <u>Advanced Clinical Practice in Pediatrics course</u>, and a pediatric track at the <u>Combined Sections Meeting</u>
- Implemented online education options for all courses to improve accibility
- Clarified methods for providing courses, including interprofessional CEUs and standardized review of proposals to ensure use of evidence and knowledge translation
- Hosted a number of topical Town Halls; if you missed them, many of which are <u>available on-demand</u> to members
- Performed environmental scan to identify pediatric-related education needs within the academic and clinical education communities
- Conducted clinical reasoning theaters via APTA's Learning Center to support students who had a reduction or elimination of clinical education experiences due to COVID
- Created a prioritized list of needs and proposed strategies to support student career opportunities
- Implemented activities to promote pediatric physical therapy careers, including PTDOS and educational podcasts
- Provided ongoing support for the <u>clinical instructor toolkit</u>
- Conducted a systematic review on the variability in pediatric physical therapy education
- Explored options for mid-career faculty development

GOAL 3: Elevate pediatric physical therapist practice through the application of evidence.

- Published quarterly issues of our <u>Pediatric Physical Therapy (PPT)</u> journal, which went onlineonly as of January 1 and now offers expanded content (access is easy – just click on the Journal logo at <u>www.pediatricapta.org</u>)
- PPT received a record 291 submissions in 2021, and published 29 research reports with accompanying clinical bottom lines, in addition to case reports, brief reports, and special communications, as well as podcasts and researcher interviews with each issue
- Renegotiated publishing contract for PPT to achieve more favorable terms.
- Created quarterly <u>Research Spotlights</u>, quarterly "<u>Pediatric Physical Therapy: Beyond the Read</u>" courses, and the <u>Residency & Fellowship Consortium</u>
- Provided resources for COVID-19, Telehealth, Annual Visit, and more
- Hosted Knowledge Broker Training (free to members)
- Updated and added to our 60+ <u>fact sheets</u>, including some in Spanish
- Evaluated the process for <u>clinical practice guidelines</u> and continued the work on creation of new CPGs
- Published DCD guideline and support resources
- Created a collaborative Concussion CPG with other academies
- Provide targeted support via our <u>10 special interest groups (SIGs</u>), including newsletters, webinars, and resource materials (SIG membership is free)
- Funded the development of systematic reviews and meta-analyses summarize the current state of knowledge
- Developed two \$500 scholarships for a researcher/clinician team to team write case reports and publish in *PPT*

- Reviewed more than 200 abstracts for CSM and AC poster and platform presentations
- Supported the development of two pediatric physical therapy researchers through the Foundation for Physical Therapy Research's (FPTR's) Promotion of Doctoral Studies scholarships
- Developed priority areas focused on advancing pediatric educational research, consistent with the APTA Pediatrics research agenda
- Supported the FPTR Pediatric Fund Research Grant (a \$40,000 grant was distributed this year!)
- Provided \$115,000 in direct research funding with 30% of funded research grants leading to physical therapist-led applications for foundation or federal funding within 3 years of completing the grant research grant application deadline is June 1
- Welcomed 192 new <u>Pediatric Certified Specialists</u> and 54 recertifying Pediatric Certified Specialists (for a total of more than 2,300), and 5 PTAs who completed the <u>Advance Proficiency</u> <u>Pathways</u> program (for a total of more than 10).

GOAL 4: Be a relevant, innovative, and responsive organization.

- Communicated with members through our <u>website</u>, <u>Milestones member newsletter</u>, <u>member</u> forums, Town Halls, and social media
- Continued refinement of the APTA Pediatrics branding, working with a consultant to improve communications with members and to explore barriers to member engagement
- Initiated monthly "Board Meeting Pearls" in *Milestones* to share Board activities
- Implemented candidate video option and voting incentive to increase member voting
- Developed a robust <u>Diversity</u>, <u>Equity</u>, <u>and Inclusion Committee</u> to decrease barriers
- Compiled APTA Pediatrics history and will begin a <u>history page</u> relaunch to celebrate APTA's 100th anniversary in 2021 and APTA Pediatrics' 50th anniversary coming up in 2024
- Welcomed a number of members into our annual mentoring program
- Provided free membership to the <u>International Organisation of Physical Therapists in Paediatrics</u> (IOPTP), a subgroup of World Physio, to every APTA Pediatrics member







Year-End Membership

There are more than 232,000 licensed physical therapists, 110,000 licensed physical therapist assistants, and 48,000 PT and PTA students nationwide; APTA's membership is right around 100,000 or about 26%. Of those 100,000, a little less than 6,000 are APTA Pediatrics members.



The APTA Pediatrics retention rate has trended above APTA's retention rate since 2017; it was 59.95% in 2021 compared to the APTA rate of 58.64%.


Year-End Course Registrations

APTA Pediatrics supported our members' need for high-quality pediatric physical therapy education in 2021, including:


- <u>APTA Pediatrics Annual Conference (AC):</u> This multi-track conference was offered online in 2021 but will be back in person (as well as online) in 2022! AC offers more than 60 sessions geared to every level and practice area of pediatric physical therapy, including a track for PCS prep, programming for students and new professionals, preconference courses, and an exhibit hall. AC 2021 had 691 attendees as of December 31 (though registrations will continue to come in through April 1). Final registration for AC20 was 905. Save the date for November 18-20, 2022, in Portland, OR!
- Innovations in School-based Practice: This course is for physical therapists who provide related services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). Held in person in Dallas, TX, Innovations 2021 had 112 attendees, down from 168 in 2019. Save the date for July 29-30, 2022, in Charleston, SC!
- Advanced Clinical Practice in Pediatrics: This course is geared for experienced pediatric physical
 therapists who have a desire to investigate current theories and evidence-based practice across
 settings. Physical therapists who are considering taking the PCS examination may want to
 participate as part of their review. Held online in 2021, ACP had 187 attendees, up from 98 in
 2019. ACP 2022 will be held in September, location TBD.
- APTA's Combined Sections Meeting: For 30+ years, APTA has facilitated this conference in which each specialty section plans a track. CSM 2021 was held online, and CSM 2022 was held in person in San Antonio, TX. CSM 2023 will be held February 22-25 in San Diego, CA!
- Online Courses: APTA Pediatrics hosts a number of online courses, including quarterly "Pediatric Physical Therapy: Beyond the Read" (text-based journal courses), the Residency & Fellowship Consortium, the Knowledge Broker Network (KBNet), and a number of on-demand informational webinars. Look for courses to be back in-person in 2022, while also offering online content!



Research Support

Since then, the Foundation has funded seven \$40,000 grants specifically for pediatric physical therapy. APTA Centennial Involvement

A century of APTA was celebrated in 2021, including the opening of new APTA headquarters in January 2021 and the APTA Centennial Celebration, Gala, Advocacy Day, and <u>Future of Physical Therapy Summit</u> in September 2021. As part of these celebrations, APTA Pediatrics sponsored two APTA Centennial Scholars who participated in activities throughout 2021 and completed a capstone project:

Josie Gannon focused her project on volunteer engagement. Due to the integral nature of volunteers in our Academy, Josie began updating and standardizing the volunteer onboarding process. This will allow volunteers' time to be utilized in a more efficient manner by identifying key training goals and focused linkages to various Academy volunteer opportunities. Volunteers will have a foundation of Academy structure and clearly defined goals for the specific volunteer opportunity to allow them to be ready to step into a position with clear expectations. The Academy's leadership and volunteer committees are working with Josie to bring her ongoing project to life.

- Emily Quinn focused on increasing the awareness of gaps in care of children in out-of-home
 care. During the project Emily created a resource sheet of key terms/definitions linked with outof-home care. She then created and presented a two-part podcast episode focused on
 increasing the awareness of how pediatric physical therapists can better serve children in outof-home care:
